## Leap Day, Lent, Lincoln, Love & Lord's Table!

Dear Church Family and Friends of FPC,

God's gospel is the sure news of His amazing grace in Jesus Christ. The Son *emptied Himself and died for our sin* [Philippians 2:6-8, 2 Cor. 5], so that we could be *filled and live* in His Spirit. God saves and blesses believers in Jesus as God's children [John 1:12], .... to the point that our "*cup runneth over.*" [Psalm 23:5]

This month marks the start of an "early" Lenten Season.\* We prepare for Lent on **Transfiguration Sunday (Feb. 7)** and then highlight Lent's beginning on **Ash Wednesday (Feb. 10)** -- with the Sunday and Wednesday services each including the covenant seal of God's amazing grace: **the Lord's Supper**. By the way, the day that Christians call Transfiguration Sunday and most Americans call "Super Bowl Sunday," our S.O.S. children will receive offering in canned food and cash to support food ministries to the poor and hungry through the **Souper Bowl of Caring**. On that note, FPC is blessed again to co-sponsor the *Veritas Forum* at Mississippi State University as part of our Outreach through our FPC University Ministries Mission. FPC Childcare Center Mission Is Alive & Active! Silent Auction Fundraiser and Other Activities Led by FPCCC Board, Staff and new PTO. As I have in previous newsletters commended our FPC Childcare Center ("FPCCC") staff and the Mississippi Building Blocks non-profit program ("MBB") staff -- now I want to commend the members of the FPCCC Board of Directors and our new Parent-Teacher Organization ("PTO") for their leadership in the renewed teaching and support activities that are revitalizing this central mission of FPC. Our congregation devotes over 10% of our church budget each year (over 10% of God's money we give to His Church) to support and make possible the existence and mission of FPCCC. Now, suplemental support from MBB has greatly bolstered our church's mission through FPCCC -- providing equipment, room upgrades, coaching of the FPCCC staff, and encouragement for the start of a PTO.

Last fall, I shared a photo from the "kick off" fellowship for the PTO; now, just a few months later, the PTO is fully active. All FPC parents, as well as parents in FPCCC, are invited to the next meeting of the PTO, on Monday, February 8 (5:30 p.m.). That meeting will feature MSU doctoral candidate Roslyn Miller – speaking on how parents can help children learn math concepts. That night will also begin this month's Silent Auction fundraiser spearheaded by the PTO for improvements to our Children's Playground. (There will be tables for the Silent Auction in Fellowship Hall from Monday, Feb. 8, through Friday, Feb. 19. To learn more about how to support the Silent Auction or, specifically, to donate items, contact either Amanda Corley in the FPCCC Director's Office or one of the members of our FPCCC Board.)

Speaking of the Board and PTO, I give special thanks for the service of Tyson Langston (a) as Chairman of the FPCCC Board of Directors that has overseen these excellent developments, and (b) as our Board liaison to the PTO. In fact, Tyson and Natalie Langston are active leaders in the PTO as parents of FPCCC children.

Will There Be Any Sledding in Starkville This Month? Finally, record levels of snow blanketed parts of the Southeast and the Eastern Seaboard of our nation in late January, and young people (such as my daughters in the Carolinas) made the most of the bad conditions by going sledding. Meanwhile, our local schools closed early on January 22 because of weather concerns, but no significant snow accumulated. All this begs the question: will Starkville see serious snow and go sledding this winter,

perhaps this month, as in 2015? I suppose we shall see.






Holy Communion will be celebrated February 7 at the 8:30 and 11:00 services, and at the 6:30p.m. Ash Wednesday service February 10.



### 2016 Miss State Veritas Forum

The second annual Veritas Forum at Mississippi State University will be held February 25, 2016, from 7 to 9 pm in the Bettersworth Auditorium of Lee Hall. For the second year First Presbyterian Church will co-sponsor the Veritas Forum at MSU with the Christian Faculty-Staff Forum and the James W. Criss Trust.

The topic for discussion is "Can We Have Martin Luther King's Dream Without His Faith?" The forum will be a conversation on the topic between Dr. Christopher Clark, Assistant Professor of Political Science at University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill and Dr. Christopher Snyder, Dean of the Shackouls Honors College and Professor of History at Mississippi State University. Dr. Susan Seal, Assistant Professor of Human Sciences at Mississippi State University will moderate the conversation. The format will also include questions from the audience.

Members and friends of First Presbyterian are invited and encouraged to participate. Another chance to participate will be a Men of the Church Breakfast on February 26 at 7:30 am in our Fellowship Hall featuring Dr. Chris Clark from UNC. He will speak about his faith and career path. Look for more details on the breakfast as the dates get closer.

The Veritas Forum at Mississippi State is an evangelical outreach effort by FPC to touch MSU students and faculty with the Gospel in an intellectual and non-confrontational way. Christianity has much to offer our modern life, and this forum helps put Christ before the University community.

You might ask, "What is the Veritas Forum"? (Veritas is Latin for "Truth.") Here is how the Veritas organization answers that question...Where does morality come from? Isn't science rapidly approaching a complete explanation of nature? Do you ever have doubts about your views? College students around the world are asking themselves and their friends these questions, but there is often no real place to explore these questions alongside brilliant faculty and leading thinkers. And, despite His undeniable prominence, Jesus is almost never brought into the picture. The Veritas Forum exists to change that landscape.

Veritas Forum began in 1992 at Harvard University. Since then, Veritas Forums have been held at Universities worldwide. Many have been held at SEC schools. This spring Veritas Forums are currently scheduled at SMU, University of Florida, University of Texas, Rice University and many more. # From the Adult Discipleship Team

#### Theology and The Importance of Biblical Doctrine

What is theology? By definition, theology is "The study of God". Everyone is a theologian, that is, everyone ought to have at least a recognition of the existence of God. There is sound theology and there is unsound theology. Sound theology adheres to *Biblical Doctrine*. Our theological (doctrinal) position affects our lives in every way. Unsound theology obviously draws us away from God. Sound theology draws us toward God. Sound theology gives us hope. It gives us assurance of salvation. It enables us to bear good fruit, fruit of the Holy Spirit, and we therefore serve and glorify God as witnesses to Jesus Christ. Sound theology learns of God or about God but more importantly, sound theology is *knowing* God; that is, having an intimate relationship with Him as opposed to simply developing a moral character. Our goal, then, is to get to know God and "...glorify God and enjoy Him forever" (WSC Q&A 1). How? As disciples (learners), by attending church worship services; having daily devotionals and Bible reading; participating in a Sunday School class and/or Bible Study group and by getting involved in other activities sponsored by our church.

# **Sunday School Classes**

New-Year Opportunity to Grow in Faith & Personal Fellowship: Sunday School Study & Fellowship at FPC! If you are not already teaching Children's Sunday School or already a member of an Adult Sunday School Class – a great new addition to your 2016 will visiting and joining one of the following excellent Bible study and fellowship groups.

#### Adult Sunday School Groups - Winter 2016 (each Sunday, 9:45-10:30 a.m.):

The Cross Community Class is our newest class, comprised mainly of young adults (college-age through early 30's -- couples and singles), with current Bible studies led by John Michael & Avent Van Horn and Will Rackley. The Cross Community Class meets Sunday mornings in Room S-6 on the main Sanctuary Building Floor (S-6 being the room down the hallway beyond the Chapel and restrooms on organ-side exit of the Sanctuary) and also has periodic small group fellowship gatherings on weekday nights in members' homes.

The New Covenant Class is taught by Jim Beaty with varied topics of Bible Study and faith & life questions, and is just beginning a study of the New Testament Letter to the Ephesians. The class is comprised of mainly of young-adult to early-middle-age couples with young children. *It meets in the large room behind the Sanctuary Balcony.* 

The Living Faith Class -- led by John & Carmen Rodgers, Laura Downey, and Briar & Michelle Jones -- is an "around the table" Bible Study and Life Application discussion class, comprised of mainly of young-adult to early-middle-age individuals and couples. The class is currently is doing week-by-week Bible discussions from the <u>Wired Word</u> series. The Living Faith Class meets in the first room up the stairs on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor of the Education Building.

**The Discovery Class** – taught by Bob Daniels – is our smallest yet most demographically diverse class (from young adult singles to grandparent couples). Bob is currently leading the group in a Bible Study of the Book of Hebrews. *The class meets on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor of the Sanctuary Building, across the hall from the music room; take the elevator or stairway on the north side of the Sanctuary Bldg.)* 

**The Chapel Class** – Robert Green, lead teacher – is comprised of middle-aged and retired individuals and couples, and is currently studying the Book of Acts. *The Chapel abuts the north side of the Sanctuary*.

The Crusader Class – Jack Forbus, lead teacher – FPC's largest class, is comprised of middle-aged and retired individuals and couples and is beginning a new study of the New Testament Letter to the Romans. *The class meets in the Fellowship Hall, on the floor below the Sanctuary.* 

The JOY ("Jesus, Others, Yourself") Class – Phil Gruchy, lead teacher – is a Bible Study class comprised of middle-aged and retired individuals and couples. This longtime class meets in The Parlor, which is the room on the lower or fellowship Hall floor, below the front, main entrance of the Sanctuary Bldg.
