The news includes exciting updates from October, including those noted in the following letter from FPC's University Minister, Ben Jackson, and Allison Jackson, giving thanks and sharing prayer requests:





To our First Presbyterian Church family,

Wow! What a month! Our October was quite full—so full that we are a tiny bit delayed in getting this letter to you. It was a month full of rich ministry opportunities and we are excited to share with you.

At our first **Monday Night Hospitality** of October, Allison was reminded by a student exactly why sharing food around a table in a home is vitally important. One of our newer students, who we will call F, has been exploring the questions we all face at some point in life: who am I? Do I matter? Is there a God? What am I supposed to do with my life? It has been a privilege to come alongside F and provide a welcoming space and a home within our community. When F sat down next to Allison that night, her words were these, "I wasn't going to come tonight because of this major exam tomorrow, but I decided I needed to come and I can already tell I was right. When I parked my car and began walking up to your house, I breathed a sigh of relief because I knew it would be okay. I would be welcomed here." Friends—this is why we do what we do. Allison cannot tell that story without getting tears in her eyes because we all want to feel welcomed and invited in. What an honor we have to be able to give Mississippi State students a taste of what Heaven will be.

On Sunday, October 6th we held our **first annual CCO/FPC Jubilee Cookout.** Our six student leaders and a few volunteers labored diligently to pull off this event and it was spectacular. Bo cooked incredible tasting meat! We were deeply appreciative of the congregation's support in showing up. It was the first time that we have had an even split between congregants and students and it was really wonderful to watch conversation develop and new relationships form. We had the privilege of welcoming 9 new students to our community at the cookout as well!

The following weekend, October 11th-13th, we took a group to the CCEF National Conference. Our group consisted of Ben and Allison, Faith, Madeleine, Emma, Madison, Sam, and Marcus. CCEF is a Biblical counseling organization that has deeply influenced Ben and Allison's categories of thinking and their national conference this year was on Anxiety. It was a full conference and we learned about how God says "Hi. I'm here, it's me. Don't be afraid," in the midst of our anxieties. It was a great dive into what Scripture says about anxiety in general, as well as the specific ways we can address people as bodies and souls as they (and we) face panic attacks, trauma, wayward relatives, and more. One really neat thing was that we were able to meet up with our friends at Clemson University and their CCO crew. It was awesome getting to know them. Thanks to the generosity of our members here at FPC, our group of students and congregants got to experience the CCEF conference without the worry of money and that was a true gift to us all.

After the conference, we had a couple of days of turnaround before heading to Philadelphia, PA for a **support raising trip**. We were able to spend a week with our community in the Philadelphia area and we were richly blessed by that time. Allison put in quite a few hours at her workplace in person, taking advantage of the opportunity since she typically works remotely. We are thankful for our time there and the relationships that we rely on to continue to propel our ministry here in Starkville forward.






